

# EVERYTHING - SOMETHING - ANYTHING - NOTHING

LOOK AT THE FOLLOWING EXAMPLES:

**Everything** is ready for the party.  
**Something** wonderful has happened.  
 There's **nothing** in the fridge to eat.  
 Is there **anything** wrong with the project?  
 I didn't see **anything** new in the shop.

• **EVERYTHING = all the things**  
**Everything** is used in a positive statement.

• **SOMETHING = a thing**  
**Something** is used in a positive statement.

• **ANYTHING** is used in a statement with a negative word. (not, never, etc.) and in questions.

• **NOTHING = no thing**  
**Nothing** is negative and is not used with another negative word.
