How to Write a Conclusion for Informational Text	 <p>Ask yourself: What do I want readers to remember?</p>
Introduction The introduction tells the reader what the topic is. Writers often use a hook, like a question or surprising statement, to get their readers interested in the topic.	Step 1: Underline the hook in the introduction paragraph.
Body Writers use the body to tell their reader important facts about the topic.	Step 2: Highlight one key word or phrase in each body paragraph that you would want a reader to remember.
Conclusion The conclusion is the last paragraph. Writers use the conclusion to remind readers what they've learned and excite them about the topic.	Step 3: Write a conclusion. <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Remind readers of the main facts.• Make a connection back to the hook.• Add a memorable ending.
